




Where are we on the Medical Campus





What is Evidence Based Medicine?





Constructing an answerable clinical question

The PICO Principle assists you in organizing and focusing your question into a searchable query.

Who are the relevant patients?

What is the management strategy, diagnostic test or exposure that you are researching?

Is there a control or alternative management strategy, test, or exposure?

What are the patient-relevant consequences?



PICO COMPONENTS

Patient/Population/Problem/Program:

Patient characteristics

(primary problem, disease, or co-existing conditions--consider sex, age or race of a patient, if relevant)

Intervention, prognostic factor, or exposure:

Main intervention, prognostic factor, or exposure being considered.

Comparison Intervention (If applicable):

Main alternative being considered to compare with the intervention

(placebo, standard therapy, no treatment, gold standard). Your clinical question does not always need a comparison.

Outcome:

What you hope to accomplish, measure, improve, or affect.

Type of Question:

Diagnosis, Therapy, Prognosis, Etiology, Guideline

Type of Study:

Randomized Controlled Trial, Cohort Study, Longitudinal Study, etc.





Abstract

Breast cancer is the most common cancer in women, and survivors with this diagnosis account for almost one fourth of the over 14 million cancer survivors in the US. After several decades of basic and clinical trials research, we have learned much about the heterogeneity of breast cancer and have evolved a complex and multidisciplinary treatment approach to the disease. Increasingly, we are paying attention to the long term and late effects of breast cancer treatment, and this is largely the subject of this volume. In this chapter, the authors introduce the topic of breast cancer survivorship and highlight the organization and content of this volume, briefly describing the contents of the subsequent chapters.



Cochrane Review Groups


- Provide reliable evidence to make important decisions on healthcare

Cochrane Children and Families groups



The **Cochrane Cystic Fibrosis and Genetic Disorders** group is an international network of healthcare professionals, researchers and consumers preparing, maintaining, and disseminating systematic reviews of randomised control trials for treating cystic fibrosis and other genetic disorders (haemoglobinopathies. coagulopathies and inborn errors of metabolism).



The **Cochrane Fertility Regulation** group addresses the process by which people regulate their fertility, family size and spacing of births.



The **Cochrane Gynaecology and Fertility** group is concerned with the systematic evaluation of the management and treatment of menstrual disorders and subfertility



The **Cochrane Incontinence** group prepares, maintains, and disseminates systematic reviews of the effectiveness of interventions for incontinence, including prevention, treatment and rehabilitation, concentrating on randomised controlled trials.



The **Cochrane Neonatal** group prepare and disseminate evidence-based, regularly updated reviews of the effects of therapies in neonatal-perinatal medicine (interventions involving the baby during the first month after birth).




The **Cochrane Pregnancy and Childbirth** group focus on interventions involving the mother or baby during and after pregnancy and childbirth (including lactation).



Cochrane Sexually Transmitted Infections focus on the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of sexually transmitted infections and genital tract infections.






