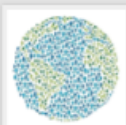

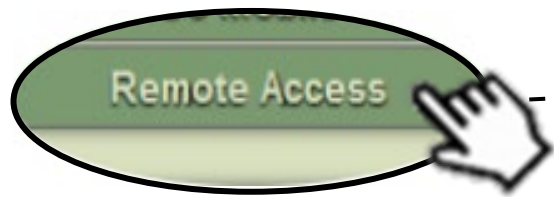



Remote access to the Louis Calder Memorial Library's ****Licensed Resources** (E-journals, E-books and Databases) is restricted to faculty, staff and students at the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine / University of Miami Health System (UMMSM/UMH) and Jackson Health System (JHS) Personnel.

Eligible off-campus users (UMMSM/UMH and JHS) can access resources in a variety of ways depending on their affiliation.

[EZ-Proxy Access](#)
Medical Library users who are on campus will have automatic access to resources. Remote access will continue to be provided with **Single Sign-On Authentication (CaneID)** for students and employees.

Remote access for non resident JMH staff will require registering for a **restricted-use CaneID/C-Number**.

Follow these steps:

- (2) Register in person at Calder Library with photo ID and provide your C# to library staff.

Secure Gateway/VPN for UMMSM and UMH faculty/staff/students:

CITRIX for UMMSM and UMH faculty/staff/students:

Abstract

Breast cancer is the most common cancer in women, and survivors with this diagnosis account for almost one fourth of the over 14 million cancer survivors in the US. After several decades of basic and clinical trials research, we have learned much about the heterogeneity of breast cancer and have evolved a complex and multidisciplinary treatment approach to the disease. Increasingly, we are paying attention to the long term and late effects of breast cancer treatment, and this is largely the subject of this volume. In this chapter, the authors introduce the topic of breast cancer survivorship and highlight the organization and content of this volume, briefly describing the contents of the subsequent chapters.
